Update from the State House

The Legislature will be sworn in on Wednesday, December 2nd and they will most likely begin regular committee meetings in the first full week of January. It is expected that the Legislature will NOT hold legislative sessions in the House and Senate Chambers until March, at the earliest. Cloture will probably be in the third week of December.

It appears that an attempt to limit out-of-state waste will be submitted by environmental organizations and some local neighbors of Juniper Ridge in the upcoming session. This group is currently petitioning the DEP to close the loophole allowing out-of-state waste at the state-owned landfill at Juniper Ridge if it is first brought in to be recycled. Proponents of a ban are arguing that more states are restricting the dumping of construction and demolition debris thus creating pressure to find a way to dump it in Maine. Those petitioning the DEP however, assume that it will not prove effective and legislation will be required. MRC will be monitoring the petition and legislation.

Annual Meeting Update
