MILESTONE! MRC & Innovative Sign Partnership

On June 30, 2023, the MRC and Innovative Resource Recovery (Innovative), a pioneering materials management company, announced the signing of a landmark agreement to become co-owners of Municipal Waste Solutions' Hampden Facility. This collaboration marks a significant step forward in advancing sustainable waste management practices and promoting a circular economy in Maine.

The Hampden plant has long been recognized as a crucial hub for effective waste processing and recycling in the region. By bringing together the expertise and resources of MRC and Innovative, this partnership aims to enhance operational efficiencies, expand recycling capabilities, and further reduce the environmental impact of municipal solid waste.

MRC Board President Karen Fussell expressed her enthusiasm for the collaboration, stating, "This partnership between MRC and Innovative represents a powerful synergy in our mission to build a more sustainable future. PERC Update

As you may be aware, PERC recently disclosed its financial difficulties. In light of this, both Innovative and MRC have extended offers to provide assistance. MRC members who were previously bypassed to PERC are now transitioning to JRL. It is important to note that, during such circumstances, information can evolve rapidly and online commenters may not have the full picture. It is worth recalling that MRC's relationship with PERC ended because its private sector owners were not interested in working with MRC to address the anticipated \$10 million per year shortfall in electricity revenue or to consider changes to PERC to modernize its technology. Since the MRC took control of the Hampden facility last August, we have made progress toward reopening to bring affordable processing technology to our region and secure a sustainable and prosperous future for members.

our expertise in resource recovery to the Hampden Facility, working alongside MRC to revolutionize waste management practices and foster a circular economy. Together, we are creating a partnership that is a model for other regions and communities to take for a more sustainable future for generations to come."

The partnership between MRC and Innovative represents a shared commitment to finding innovative solutions for waste management challenges, promoting recycling, and reducing the reliance on landfilling. Through this collaboration, both organizations aim to set new standards for sustainable waste management practices and make a positive impact on the environment and local communities.

What's Next?

Looking ahead, we are thrilled to announce that on July 27, both MRC and Innovative will be present at MWS to conduct equipment testing using approximately 30 tons of MSW. As part of the due diligence process, the equipment was previously turned on, but this upcoming test, with the participation of Maine DEP officials and the equipment manufacturer, will allow us to determine the necessary configuration adjustments for optimal performance. Additionally, it will help identify priority areas for investments, which is particularly crucial given the uncertainties surrounding waste management at present.

For this test, MRC has carefully chosen a crosssection of MRC members representing different recycling approaches, including communities that engage in mixing and sorting, those utilizing curbside recycling, and those relying on local transfer stations for recycling. This diverse selection will assist us in planning efforts.
